JCAA Fisheries Management & Legislative Report

There is information about two upcoming meetings below. I am an optimist. I am hoping some of you will attend the upcoming meetings virtually. With virtual meetings you don't need to leave home. You can attend and comment online. There are no travel expenses, and your voice makes a difference.

Sometimes I feel like a broken record. We alert you to upcoming meetings and the meetings I attend have few if any members of the recreational community in attendance. The same four or five recreational members are always the ones in attendance. The commercial community does a better job in getting people to attend and voicing their strong opinions about decisions to be made. The recreational community relies on others to attend. We need you to attend. I know I am repeating myself but it is frustrating when there is no public input from the recreational community. Please help.

PowerPoint Presentation

The JCAA has just updated our PowerPoint presentation that covers JCAA's mission. If you contact John Toth, the new membership chairman, or me we will try to get someone to your club to share this presentation.

When we put together this presentation years ago, I included the number of meetings JCAA Board members attend. With this update, I left in the number of 400 or more attended by JCAA members in a year. I was questioned about this number because there was some fear that this number would be challenged. I explained that in the month of January I have attended 16 meetings for JCAA, not including the upcoming week for ASMFC. These meetings are not always all day and include lengthy phone calls or webinars that a representative of JCAA should attend. If you are a board member, you attend the monthly board and general meeting. This does not include special meetings for issues like the fluke tournament. We are also attending meetings on wind, meetings for organizations, council meetings other and commission meetings. When I do a total, I think 400 is a low number. My number alone is at least 200 meetings/contacts each year. A few year ago I totaled the number of years I spent at commission meetings and at that point already totaled 3 years of meetings.

The reason we all have to attend so many meetings is because those meetings are important to recreational fishing.

That brings me to the other problem. When I started volunteering for JCAA we had 15 - 20 people helping with our operations. They came from many different clubs and we were able to work together. When I first went on the board in 1986, I was the fifth youngest board member. That was a long time ago and I have gotten much older. But the sad fact is I am still the fifth youngest board member. As you know, Paul Turi is retiring as office manager and fluke tournament director. He does a great deal more than just these two jobs. He will be sorely missed. I need for the clubs to

get their members to get involved. This is the only way to protect our right to fish. We need the perspectives of the 30, 40 and 50 year old members who are not on the board. Without these perspectives, contributions, time and energy, JCAA, like other organizations, will simply die. Ask us to come visit your club and see if we can motivate your members to help keep JCAA strong.

Mid-Atlantic Fishery Management Council has Released its February 2022 Meeting Agenda

The ASMFC Policy Board will be meeting with the Council (via webinar) on Tuesday, February 8th from 2-5 PM to consider approval for public comment the Council's Recreational Harvest Control Rule Framework and the Commission's Draft Addenda for Summer Flounder, Scup, Black Sea Bass, and Bluefish.

Please note that immediately prior to this meeting, the Council will consider revising the Council recommendation for 2022 recreational management measures (if needed) in response to possible action the Commission's Summer Flounder, Scup and Black Sea Bass Management Board may take in January at the Commission's Winter Meeting.

February 2022 Council Meeting (Webinar)

The Mid-Atlantic Fishery Management Council's next meeting will be held Tuesday, February 8 -Wednesday, February 9, 2022. Due to concerns about the continued spread of COVID-19, this meeting will be conducted entirely by webinar. A portion of the meeting will be conducted jointly with the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission's ISFMP Policy Board

Two Meetings on Draft Amendment 14

A supplement to Draft Amendment 14 to the 2006 Consolidated Atlantic Highly Migratory Species Fishery Management Plan

We will hold a special HMS Advisory Panel meeting and a Public Hearing webinar to make additional public comment period to discuss the supplement. To get all the information and documents go to <u>this link</u>.

Half-Day Advisory Panel Webinar

A half-day HMS AP webinar is scheduled for Friday February 11 from 8 a.m. to 11 a.m. It is a meeting to discuss the Supplement to Draft Amendment 14.

What is this Supplement? The supplement revises one of the preferred management options for Draft Amendment 14 that received several comments and questions. Based on feedback during the comment period, we added more details and reworked this option.

The Supplement to Draft Amendment 14 provides more details regarding the preferred Management Option A3 on the tiered acceptable biological catch (ABC) control rule. Based on public comments, NOAA Fisheries reworked Management Option A3 so the tiers apply to all sharks that have a stock status of healthy (i.e., not subject to overfishing and not overfished), experiencing overfishing, or unknown. Shark stocks that are: (1) under a rebuilding plan, (2) assessed (or could be assessed) by the scientific body of the International Commission for the Conservation of Atlantic Tunas (ICCAT), or (3) in the prohibited shark complex would be outside of these tiers. There are no regulations, changes to quotas, or HMS fishery management measures associated with Draft Amendment 14 or the supplement.

NJ HOFNOD FUNDING

Please mention to your clubs that we would like to continue our efforts to increase funds for NJ HOFNOD. We are asking you write to your legislators. The importance of properly funding NJ HOFNOD is essential to provide needed funds to expand NJ HOFOD. The bill appropriates \$450,000 to the Department of Environmental Protection to fund the cost of implementing the Hooked on Fishing-Not on Drugs Program. The money would be appropriated from the "Drug Enforcement and Demand Reduction Fund," a statutory account established to receive fines and penalties from convicted drug offenders that are used to support State-authorized drug and alcohol abuse abatement programs. The bill encourages the Legislature to appropriate sufficient funding annually from the "Drug Enforcement and Demand Reduction Fund" or any other appropriate source to maintain the operation of the program in future years.

FREE MOBILE SPORTFISHING PERMIT

We remind all eligible disabled veterans to apply for an IBSP 2022 Mobile Sportfishing Permit to drive on the beach. Please apply for your mobile permit ASAP as there is a limited amount available. Veterans must supply the following: Form DD 214 Honorable Discharge, Valid NJ Driver License and Registration, Veterans ID Card proof of service-connected disability. If you plan to fish on the beach you must register for a Free NJ Saltwater Recreational Registration Card. It is suggested new beach drivers take a beach safety driving course.
